What changed?

Curriculum Development

All subjects to be across the curriculum to be developed and designed so there are opportunities for active learning

Practice

All teachers to incorporate active learning into lessons. Support staff to receive additional training

Policy Review

Uniform and teaching and learning policy to be updated

What enabled the change?

Brave Leadership

SLT and all the staff understand the benefits of active learning.

Doing Things Differently

SLT sought a new way to maximise learning opportunities and provide active ways for children to learn to help improve behaviour, progress and attainment.

Learning Together

Staff training and development on different active learning strategies

Outcomes

- Children enjoy active learning opportunities and ALL children participate in the learning.
- Children are more engaged in lessons.
- There are more opportunities for collaborative learning and problem solving, helping children to build and develop social connections.
- Reduced teacher workload - teachers can record active learning easily using Blippit Boards making evidencing simpler.
- Teachers are aware and can notice the positive outcomes of active learning
- Teachers are reporting that there are less behaviour disruptions... leading to more learning!

What next?

Teaching and learning policy
